Top Outdoor Recreation

- Hiking Black Elk Peak, the highest point in the state.
- Rock Climbing the Needles at Custer State Park.
- Kayaking the flatwater of the Missouri River.

Cost of Living

- Approximately 11% lower than the national average.
- Housing is particularly affordable, with a median rent of around \$800/month.
- Lower cost of living than Colorado, Utah, or Wyoming while offering similar outdoor appeal.

Must-See Places

Badlands National Park: Explore otherworldly rock formations and dramatic landscapes.

Spearfish Canyon Scenic Byway: A stunning drive with waterfalls and lush greenery.

Jewel Cave National Monument: Take a guided tour through the fifth-longest cave in the world and explore the stunning calcite crystals.

Sturgis Motorcycle Rally: Rock out at the world's largest motorcycle rally, held annually in August in Sturgis.
